


The slate industry was central to life in the Ogwen Valley for generations. However, the influence of major estates such as Penrhyn and Faenol extended far beyond their quarries. This project sets out to reveal the experiences of those people who lived and worked on local estates – as tenants, farmers, domestic servants, woodmen and gamekeepers – and explore how the priorities and actions of leading landowners impacted upon their lives.
