Important Information for EU/EEA Students

As you may be aware, in June 2016 the UK government held a referendum on whether or not the UK should remain part of the European Union, and 52 % of voters chose to leave the bloc. Although Article 50 of the Lisbon Treaty was triggered in March 2017, it is still unclear when the UK will be leaving the EU and on what conditions. This unfortunately

means that at this stage there is little certainty as to what implications the result of the referendum will have for the EU/EEA nationals living in the UK in future. What we do know however is that the process of leaving the EU is likely to take a minimum of two years from the date the UK gave notification of its intention to leave the union (29 March 2017). The position of EU/EEA nationals in the UK remains unchanged throughout this time.


"Confucius Institute put up a stall at **Trakz**, a busking festival with fringe events held at Llandudno Junction on the 22nd of April.


