Internationals for a cleaner future!

"A team of 50 international students from all over the World took part in a Beach Clean in Criccieth last Saturday, 25th of March. This was organised by the International Student Support Office at Bangor University as part of their Sustainability Project Internationals Go Green! together with The North Wales Wildlife Trust.



Little did they know that a large amount of litter was

expecting them in such a famous and beautiful Welsh spot. The students, who gave up their free time to help the environment, ventured into the furthest part of Criccieth beach with litter picks, bin bags and tons of enthusiasm. In only 2 hours, 26 big bags of litter had been collected with anything from plastic bottles to fishing gear and cans. No matter how much work they put into it however, the beach could not be totally cleaned.

As described by Portuguese student Ruth Gabriella Fernandes, who is studying for a BSc in Clinical and Health Psychology, "The beach clean at Criccieth was a real eye-opener. From afar, the beach looked pretty clean and beautiful, but when you look closely amongst the weeds, it was the tiny plastic that made up most of the litter". Two of the most common items found were bottle caps and, believe it or not, earbuds. Hundreds of earbud plastic sticks washed ashore were collected in just a morning in Criccieth due to inappropriate disposal. "The enormous amount of earbud



sticks that we found and collected from the beach made me appreciate how simple mistakes made in the bathroom, as regards to waste disposal, pose a threat to marine ecosystem some miles away" said Gracious Ali, a Malawian MSc student in Public Health & Health Promotion.

With Bangor aiming to become the first Plastic Free City in the UK, we can all do our bit to help the environment. But, what can you do? "Going plastic free is really the way to go to avoid contaminating the oceans. If not plastic free, recycle and reuse your bottles, avoid dumping earbuds into toilets and avoid using straws!" said Ruth.



We can make a difference, it is not too late. By making little daily life changes in our behaviour we can secure a cleaner environment that will be better and safer for us and for the next generations. However, this implies making an active effort towards a better future. Will you make that effort? It's for us.

International Student meets Welsh political leader

Medical Cannabis and the UK, a possible relationship?

Recently, Jonathan Joe Hernández González, an international student from a Master Degree in Bangor University met with the leader from the Plaid Cymru (Party of Wales) Mrs. Leanne Wood in Cardiff to show the results from his dissertation related to the actual perception of cannabis in North Wales.

Mr. Hernández presented Mrs. Wood with his data which was collected from British citizens living in North Wales. The data included the thoughts and beliefs of people aged between 18 and 90 years old about cannabis in general, the perception of the plant, the issues related to the benefits in some diseases, and their opinions from a possible consumption if a doctor recommends the use of cannabis for treating some symptoms after an eventual legalisation.

This document is aligned with the Party's political agenda that is being debated in the National Assembly for Wales, where the Welsh Government should ask the UK Government to reschedule cannabis for medicinal purposes.

In this study, Mr. Hernández demonstrates, with the help of Bangor academics, the importance of addressing this issue from an objective perspective as it has a major interest from people all over the World.


De-Stresstival starts on the 30th of April and kicks off with Buddy Bags and Craft Corner events on the Monday at 2 at Undeb Bangor."
