The International Students' Society welcomes you!


"Starting afresh, the Bangor International Students' Society (BISS) wants to invite all new and returning students to our regular events and sessions this year.

Kuwaiti Students in Bangor


"The Kuwaiti Students in Bangor Society was established in Bangor University in 2016.

HEAR: Recognition for your University Activities and Achievements

When you graduate, in addition to your degree certificate, you will be presented with a comprehensive transcript of everything (that Bangor University recognises) that you have achieved academically, or been involved with throughout your time as a student, including any extracurricular activity that has been verified by the University (e.g. peer guiding, societies, SVB volunteering).

This transcript is called a HEAR - Higher Education Achievement Report. Its main purpose is to allow your strengths to be clearly defined and distinguished, whilst providing easy access, for both you and any prospective employers, to a secure electronic record of Bangor University-related achievements.

You can record all of your activities for the HEAR by using the My Employability Hub page on MyBangor. Through this system, you can also take part in the Bangor Employability Award.




