Church Buildings

Grants are awarded to improve or renovate church buildings in Wales, especially when those renovations are clearly linked with developing the mission and outreach work of the church, or encouraging co-operation between churches or between the church and the local community.

Resources or Equipment

Applications are invited from churches wishing to buy expensive resources or equipment, e.g. technical or musical equipment or resources for specific projects especially interdenominational projects or projects developing the church's involvement with the community. The church must be part of a wider denominational structure in Wales or registered as a charity, and must also hold regular services.

Publications in the fields of religion, theology or philosophy

Applications can be submitted for grants to support publications in the fields of religion, theology or philosophy, when those publications are not eligible to apply for grants from other publishing sources. The applicant must have a permanent address in Wales for at least three years prior to submitting an application.

Postgraduate Students

The Foundation supports postgraduate students from Wales by contributing towards tuition fees of Masters or PhD courses. Applicants must have a permanent address in Wales; they must also either have been born in Wales, or have at least one parent born in Wales, or have studied for at least 7 years in Wales. The closing date for applications is the end of June each year.

Eisteddfodau

Annual grants are awarded to local, regional and national eisteddfodau in Wales. The eisteddfod must be registered as a charity or organised under the auspices of an organisation which is registered as a charity. The financial contribution made by the Foundation is based on a percentage of the prize money paid at the previous eisteddfod and no other costs are recognised.

Intensive training courses

Grants are awarded to support the costs of intensive training courses undertaken by ministers and Christian workers or leaders in Wales. These courses must contribute directly towards developing ministry and mission. The applicant must be a member, or be involved on a regular basis, with a Christian church in Wales.
